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Day 1 - Tuesday, June 17
Departure from USA(D - On Flight)

Depart from the city of your choice to meet up with our group in Chicago at O'Hare Airport.

DAY 2 - Wednesday, June 18
Arlanda Airport Sweden Uppsala, Sweden - (B on flight, D)

Morning arrival at Arlanda International airport near Stockholm, Sweden. To begin your tour of Sweden, journey through the province of Uppland (one of 25 provinces of Sweden) to beautiful Uppsala. In Uppsala, enjoy a tour of magnificent Uppsala Cathedral whose construction began in 1260 and is today the largest Cathedral in Sweden and Scandinavia as a whole. Visit the amazing Viking burial mounds and museum at Gamla Uppsala. Dinner and overnight in Uppsala, at a Four-Star Hotel.

Free time after dinner for exploring on your own, this major city of the homeland of Sweden.

DAY 3 - Thursday, June 19
Uppsala -- Avesta -- Sundborn -- Falun -- (B,D)

Travel to the tradition-rich and folkloristic province of Dalarna, Sweden today. Stop at Avesta to see the World's Largest Dala Horse (unique to Sweden), standing almost 43 feet high and weighing 67 tons. In the village of Sundborn, our tour of Sweden visits the beautiful home and studio of beloved Swedish artists Carl and Karin Larsson. Also visit the Sundborn Church and the Larsson family grave site. Also of interest is the Carl Larsson portrait collection. We will dine in the area, before

participating in arrangements with the Sundborn Hembygdsförening to enjoy Pre-Midsummer activities this evening. Drive to Falun for overnight at Four-Star Hotel.

DAY 4 - Friday, June 2
Falun -- Nusnäs -- Mora -- Sundborn - Falun (B,D)

Today is Sweden's Midsummer's Eve, the largest and best summer celebration in Scandinavia. Enjoy the beauty of idyllic Lake Siljan as you explore the region today. Visit centuries old Rättvik Church with its hundreds of tiny wooden "houses" used centuries ago, to stable horses in winter during the long church services. Travel to Nusnäs to visit Nils Olsson's Hemslöjd, gift shop and Dala Horse factory, and watch as expert painters hand-paint a Unique to Sweden, Dala horse, in a matter of minutes.

Take time to shop, enjoy a cup of coffee, or stroll across the street to Grannas Olsson's for more shopping at their Hemslöjd. In Mora, tour the fantastic home (Zorngården), of world-renowned Swedish artist Anders Zorn. The main room here is reminiscent of a Viking ship. We return to Sundborn for the late afternoon and evening, Swedish Midsummer Procession, folk music, folk dancing, and the raising of the Midsummer Pole (Midsommarstång). Overnight again in Falun.

DAY 5 - Saturday, June 21
(Swedish Midsummer Day) - Falun - Sunnemo - Medskog - Mårbacka - Karlstad - (B,L,D)

Depart the beautiful Lake Siljan area of Sweden, traveling into the province of Värmland to visit the quaint village of Sunnemo where Mr. Alf Brorson, historian and educator will talk about Swedish religion and emigration to America in the early 19th century. We will take part in a special Swedish-American Midsommar dag church service at Sunnemo Church.

After Noon, enjoy a delicious traditional Värmland lunch of potatiskorv (potato sausage), fresh potatoes, ostkaka and lingonberries at a delightful country inn hosted by Barbro Folkesson. After lunch take the short drive for a visit to Selma Lagerlöf's home of Mårbacka.

Lagerlöf was the first woman recipient of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1909. Continue to Karlstad for dinner and overnight at a four-star hotel. Late evening stroll to see Östra Bron, one of the oldest stone bridges still in use in Sweden today.

DAY 6 - Sunday, June 22nd
Karlstad - Sjötorp - Åsle Tå - Habo - Gothenburg - (B,L)

This morning we travel south on your tour of Sweden, into the province of Västergötland to see the locks at work at Sjötorp where the Göta Canal meets Lake Vänern. Just outside of Falköping visit Åsle Tå, the incredibly well-preserved Swedish peasant village from the 19-20th centuries. We'll enjoy a lunch buffet at Åsle Tå. Travel to the western shore of Lake Vättern to visit beautiful Habo Church, famous for the interior biblical paintings on walls and ceilings. Continue to the west coast of Sweden to Göteborg (Gothenburg), the second largest city in Sweden. Overnight in Gothenburg at four-star hotel. Evening visit to Liseberg Amusement Park is included in tour cost. Enjoy dinner on your own at one of the many fantastic restaurants located in the park. city with still more to come.

DAY 7 - Monday, June 23
Gothenburg - Varberg - Helsingborg (B,D)

In Gothenburg (Göteborg, Sweden) this morning enjoy the highlights of this lively West Coast city founded in 1621. Included in the city tour of Gothenburg will be a visit to the Masthuggskyrkan (church) for a wide view of the city. We now travel on the West Coast of Sweden to the province of Halland and the small town of Varberg chartered in 1100 A.D. to visit the site of the Varberg Fästning (Fortress). From there we will see Varberg's beautiful sandy beaches which have earned it the nickname of the "Swedish Riviera". We enter the province of Skåne.

Sweden Highlights Tour (cont.)

June 17 - June 30, 2025

At Ängelholm we will swing off the main road to admire the landscape and idyllic half-timbered houses of The Kullen Peninsula. In Helsingborg, Sweden, just across from Helsingør, Denmark take a stroll on the walking street or take in the view across the Öresund Strait from the Kärnan Castle. Look across to Denmark and Kronborg Castle (Elsinore - the home of Shakespeare's Hamlet) at Helsingør. Three miles of water separate these two cities and two countries. On your own time after dinner, feel free to enjoy the opportunity of taking the 2- minute ferry ride across the Öresund to visit Denmark (TourSweden Tours can help you purchase a ticket). Perhaps investigate the Kärnan tower, Helsingborg's most famous landmark, which has guarded the city for over 600 years. Dinner and overnight in Helsingborg at a four-star hotel.

DAY 8 - Tuesday, June 24
Helsingborg -- Lund -- Hässleholm - Karlshamn -- Växjö - (B,D)

We motor to the University city of Lund, Sweden to visit the beautiful 12th century Lund Cathedral with its amazing astronomical clock dating from 1424. We make a stop in Hässleholm at a Swedish second-hand store and enjoy an open-faced sandwich on your own, or even a freshly baked cardamom roll. Travel through the province of Blekinge, known as the "Garden of Sweden", to view the Emigrant Monument in Karlshamn, commemorating emigration to America through characters

from Vilhelm Moberg's classic novel "The Emigrants" (Karl-Oskar and Kristina). Enjoy a little free time for shopping or leisure in Karlshamn. This afternoon travel to Växjö on your tour of Sweden, in the province of Småland where we will enjoy a self-guided tour of the museum at the Emigrant Institute (Utvrändarnas Hus). Dinner and overnight in Växjö at a four-star hotel. Växjö is the administrative center for the province of Småland, Sweden.

DAY 9 - Wednesday June 25
Växjö -- Långasjö -- Kosta Boda - Kalmar - (B,D)

TourSweden Tours has you traveling the "Emigrant Trail" to Långasjö to visit the living museum at Klasatorpet where parts of the movie, "The Emigrants" (starring Liv Ullman and Max von Sydow), were filmed. Before we arrive we'll visit the Ljuder Church and its museum, and see the Åkerby Crossroads (where Emigrants met). Deep in the forests of Småland, Sweden enter the "Crystal Kingdom" to tour the 280-year old Kosta-Boda Glassworks. We will pay a visit to a Moose Park (Algparken), where we will see live moose up close. Then end the day of touring in Sweden, in the old city of Kalmar located on the Kalmarsund of the Baltic Sea Swedish Coastline. Dinner and overnight at a four-star hotel. Free time to stroll around the town.

DAY 10 - Thursday, June 26
Kalmar - Oskarshamn - Eksjö - Jönköping - (B,D)

This morning our tour of Sweden takes us to the 13th Century Kalmar Castle (Kalmar Slott), once a vital defense along the Old Danish border with Sweden. Falling on hard times, the castle had been used as a prison and as a storage facility for salt and grain; today it is one of Sweden's best-preserved renaissance castles. Travel north along the East Coast to

Oskarshamn, still in the province of Småland, Sweden for a tour at the Axel Pettersson Woodcarving Museum. Axel, also known as "Döderhultarn" was one of Sweden's most prolific woodcarvers of the 19th and 20th Centuries. We continue to Eksjö to enjoy a walking tour of the wonderfully preserved Old Town area from the 17th century. Burned to the ground by the Danish army in 1568, the town was redeveloped in 1569. Your tour of Sweden continues on the road for

Dinner and overnight in Jönköping at a Four-star hotel on the south shore of Lake Vättern. Another unique hotel chosen by TourSweden Tours.

DAY 11 - Friday, June 27 -
Jönköping - Gränna - Bergs Slussar (Locks) - Stockholm (B,D)

Your tour of Sweden continues from Jönköping as we drive along the shores of beautiful Lake Vättern to the village of Gränna, stopping at Gränna Polkagris (peppermint candy) factory/candy store. We'll see the famous Swedish candy made in front of us and will be able to purchase polkagrisar at factory prices. We also make a stop at a chocolate candy factory and watch the production there. On the way to Stockholm, we will stop at the Viking Age Runestone "Rökstenen" which details a family's saga. We pay a visit to Mantorps Glasbruk for a demonstration of the art of glassblowing, and have a chance to purchase factory direct crystal products such as crystal birds and Crystal Dala Horses. Just outside of Linköping we make a stop at the Berg Locks (Bergs Slussar) to watch the boats maneuver through the system of locks on the famous Göta Canal.

Tour Sweden Tours has you down for an early evening arrival in Stockholm. Dinner and overnight in Stockholm at a Four-Star Hotel.

DAY 12 - Saturday, June 28
Stockholm (B,D)

TourSweden Tours has you enjoying a morning tour of Stockholm, which includes City Hall, the Wasa Ship Museum, which houses the restored Wasa Ship that sank on its maiden voyage in the 17th Century, the magnificent view of the city from Fjellgatan Street and Gamla Stan (Old Town). Also witness the changing of the guards at the Royal Palace. This afternoon, our tour visits Skansen Outdoor (Open-Air) Museum. This is known as "Sweden in a Nutshell". Many tour participants are interested also in the ABBA museum across the street.

Dinner at our hotel this evening. Overnight in Stockholm at a four-star hotel.

DAY 13 - Sunday, June 29
Stockholm (Sweden's Venice of the North) (B,D)

Today is a free day. Your tour escort and guide with TourSweden Tours will help you with suggestions or even accompany a small group. Perhaps visit one of the many museums. Return to Gamla Stan, stroll the walking street, visit one the world famous department stores or take a cruise on the archipelago. Contact us about day cruises. Enjoy! This evening TourSweden Tours participants will enjoy our dinner at our hotel. Overnight again in Stockholm at a four-star hotel.

DAY 14 - Monday, June 30
Stockholm -- Departure to U.S.A. (B-at hotel then D-on flight)

Some free time this morning to finish packing and last minute shopping. We transfer by motorcoach to Stockholm - Arlanda Airport for late afternoon departure to Chicago. 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Day 1 - Sunday, AUGUST 10th
Departure from Chicago USA -
Copenhagen, Denmark

Meals Included: Dinner on Flight
Today Tour Sweden Tours group
departs on our overnight Trans-
Atlantic flight from Chicago to
Copenhagen, Denmark. Join us
from various cities in the USA.

Day 2 - Monday, AUGUST 11th
Arrival in Copenhagen, Denmark
Meals Included: Breakfast on
flight and Dinner

After we arrive midday at
Kastrup Airport, we will have a
guided tour of "Wonderful
Copenhagen." This will include
the beautiful *Little Mermaid*
statue on the bay by the water.
On this tour we will also see
Amalienborg Palace, the Danish
King Frederik's residence and
much more.

Copenhagen is an amazing city!
After dinner we will overnight in
Copenhagen at a Four-Star
Hotel. Free time to visit Tivoli
Gardens and amusement park.

Day 3 - Tuesday, AUGUST 12th
Copenhagen - Malmö, Sweden -
Lund - Hässleholm - Växjö

Meals Included: Breakfast and
Dinner

Tour Sweden Tours group
departs Copenhagen this morning.
We will cross over to Sweden on
the remarkable Öresund Bridge
to Malmö, where we enter the
"Kingdom of Sweden".

Thought to have been founded
around 1275, Malmö was an im-
portant part of the Hanseatic
League, was home to one of the
world's largest shipyards and
until the 1970's was an indus-
trial leader. We will spend some
time in the Stortorget and Lilla
Torget area taking in the half-
timbered buildings and open
markets.

We then travel to the city of
Lund, where more half-
timbered buildings from the
16th century blend seamlessly
into the modern landscape. We
will visit 12th-century Lund
Cathedral with its amazing
Astronomical Clock from
around the year 1424 A.D.

We continue to Växjö to visit
the extensive museum
at the Emigrant Institute
(Utvandrarnas Hus). Between
1840 and 1930 about 1.3 million
Swedes emigrated to America
and one out of twenty-five
Americans living today have
Swedish ancestors. Dinner and
overnight in Växjö at Clarion
Collection Hotel Cardinal.

**Day 4 - Wednesday, AUGUST
13th** Växjö - Kosta Boda, Målerås -
Eksjö - Jönköping

Meals Included: Breakfast and
Dinner

This morning we drive through
the forests of Småland to the
world renowned "Crystal
Kingdom". We'll enjoy visiting
and shopping at the 279 year old
crystal factory of Kosta. Then con-
tinue on to the famous Målerås
Glassworks factory famous for
Mats Jonasson etched glass.
From Målerås we drive north, still
in the province of Småland, to
Eksjö for a walking tour in the
charming old town center from
the 16th and 17th Centuries, rela-
tively unchanged since that time
period. Late afternoon we will
continue to Jönköping, where we
will enjoy dinner and overnight
at Clarion Collection Hotel
Victoria. Tour Sweden Tour has
taken you to the southern tip of
Lake Vättern, Sweden's second
largest lake.

Day 5 - Thursday, AUGUST 14th
Jönköping - Gränna -
Mantorp - Berg Locks (Göta
Kanal) - and Stockholm

Meals Included: Breakfast
and Dinner

In the morning as we drive
along the Eastern shoreline of
Lake Vättern we will make a
stop at the town of Gränna,
the polkagris (peppermint
candy) capital of Sweden.



We will watch the candy being
made and will be able to buy
from the factory-direct shop at
Franssons' Polkagris Fabrik.
On the way to Berg we will
make a stop at a Chocolate fac-
tory near Ödeshög and then
see the Rökstenen (Rök
Runestone) from the Viking
Age and also along the way we
stop at Mantorp.

In Mantorp Tour Sweden
Tours group will visit the
Mantorps Glasbruk for a dem-
onstration of glassblowing by
their Master Glassblower. This
is where the famous crystal
Blue Birds of Happiness are
made as well as other objects
such as crystal dala horses and
crystal decorative blocks.

At the village of Berg near
Vreta Koster, we will stop at
the Berg Locks (Bergs Slussar)
on the Göta Canal to watch
the boats navigate the locks on
this the largest set of locks
along the Canal.

We continue on to
Stockholm the capital city of
Sweden. Dinner and overnight
in Stockholm at Clarion
Collection Hotel Taptö.

Day 6 - Friday, AUGUST 15th *Stockholm*

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner

Today will be a full day in Stockholm beginning with a guided tour of this beautiful city, also known as "Venice of the North".

We will tour the impressive City Hall (Stadshuset), the famous Wasa Ship Museum (Vasamuseet) and observe the changing of the guard at the Royal Palace (Kungliga Slottet). After lunch on our own in nearby Gamla Stan (Old Town) you can do some more exploring and shopping on your own on the narrow streets of Gamla Stan (Old Town). We'll take a photo op from the heights of Södermalm. One the way to Skansen we will see Embassy Row.

Tour Sweden Tours will provide transportation to visit Skansen Outdoor Museum on your own. Skansen is also known as "Sweden in a Nutshell". Dinner and overnight in Stockholm again at Clarion Collection Hotel Tapto.

Day 7 - Saturday, AUGUST 16th *Stockholm - Uppsala - Avesta - Sundborn-Rättvik*

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner

Our Tour Sweden Tours group heads north into the province of Uppland to the university town of Uppsala to tour the inspiring Uppsala Cathedral. Construction of the cathedral began in the thirteenth century, took more than a century to complete and is the largest cathedral in Scandinavia.

We continue to the tradition-rich province of Dalarna, stop-

ping at Avesta to see the world's largest Dala Horse, weighing in at 67 tons. In the small village of Sundborn outside of Falun, we will visit the home and studio of beloved artists Carl & Karin Larsson as well as the Sundborn Church.

We will pay a visit to the Sundborn Hembygdsgård before continuing on to Rättvik. Still in Sundborn we will enjoy dinner and entertainment at the Vicarage from the 18th century. Then overnight at Hotel Stiftsgården. The hotel is situated in an idyllic part of Rättvik very near Lake Siljan, a favorite of Tour Sweden Tours.

Day 8 - Sunday, AUGUST 17th *Rättvik - Nusnäs - Mora, - Karlstad*

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner

Tour Sweden Tours group first stop of the day will be at the Rättvik Church for a visit in the Church and to see the old horse stable log buildings from the 1700's. Farther up the road at Nusnäs we will witness the genuine Dala horses (Mora Hästar) being made and hand-painted by local craftspeople. We take the short jaunt into Mora to tour Zorngården, the fantastic home of world-renowned artist Anders Zorn. We continue through the forests of the provinces of Dalarna and Värmland to Karlstad on the shores of Lake Vänern (Europe's third largest lake). On the way to Karlstad, we will stop to see the fantastic Iron Crosses at Ekshärad Church. Dinner and overnight in Karlstad at Clarion Collection Hotel Bilan. One point of interest on your own would be to stroll over to the 18th Century stone bridge still being used today.

Day 9 - Monday, AUGUST 18th *Karlstad - Oslo, Norway*

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner

This morning Tour Sweden Tours departs Karlstad and drive

west towards the Kingdom of Norway and over the border to Oslo (to check on the Norwegian neighbors), the capital city of Norway.

Upon arrival we will enjoy a delightful guided tour of this 1000-year old city. Some of the sights we will see include the Kon Tiki Museum (Thor Heyerdahl, the Viking Ship Museum (closed for renovations until 2025), The Vigeland statues in Frogner Park. See the view of the city from the Holmenkollen Ski Jump, site of the 1952 Winter Olympics.

Enjoy some relaxing and reflection time in the late afternoon and evening after dinner. Dinner and overnight in Oslo at one of the Clarion Collection Hotels.

Day 10 - Tuesday, AUGUST 19th *Oslo - Bergen*

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner

Depart Early morning on the Oslo to Bergen mountain train, through the valleys, into the mountains, over the high plateau, then down into the West Coast City of Bergen. All in all about a 7 hour train ride taking in fantastic scenery along the way. Mid-afternoon arrival in Bergen. We will enjoy a guided tour of this charming city of Bergen, which includes the Hanseatic League Quarter, Bryggen (The Warehouse District), the Fish Markets. Dinner and overnight in Bergen at a four-star hotel. Free time perhaps to ride the Funicular to the top of the mountain or go back to the Warehouse district for more sightseeing.

Day 11 - Wednesday, AUGUST 20th

Bergen - "Norway in a Nutshell Fjord Tour"

Meals Included: Breakfast and Dinner.

This morning we depart on the world famous "Norway In A Nutshell" tour, taking the train to Myrdal where we will board the Flåm mountain train. This train descends 2,900 feet in 12 short miles through breathtaking scen-

ery to the fjord village of Flåm. In Flåm, board the fjord boat to cruise the Aurlandsfjord and the narrowest of fjords, the Nærøfjord to the village of Gudvangen.

We continue on by bus towards the village of Voss. On the way we pay a visit to the famous Stalheim Hotel Grounds with views of the valley below. Visit their gift shop and perhaps the famous Nazi bunker from World War II. In Voss, we will visit the memorial to the famous Notre Dame coach Knute Rockne. Rockne was born in Voss (Rokne) and emigrated to America with his family when he was five years old. We will enjoy a dinner at the Voss Hotel before we continue by train back to Bergen for overnight at Hotel Zander K.

Time to pack for your return to the United States or if everything is ready to go, enjoy some free time walking in the Warehouse District. Free time in the evening. Overnight again at Hotel Zander K. Tour Sweden Tours escort will go over tomorrow morning's schedule with departure with everyone.

Day 12 - Thursday, August 21st *Bergen, Norway - Departure to USA*

Meals Included: Breakfast and (lunch and dinner on flights)

Transfer by bus or taxi bus to Bergen's Flesland Airport for the return flight to The U.S.A.. Scandinavian Delights tours ends at entrance to security checks at airport.

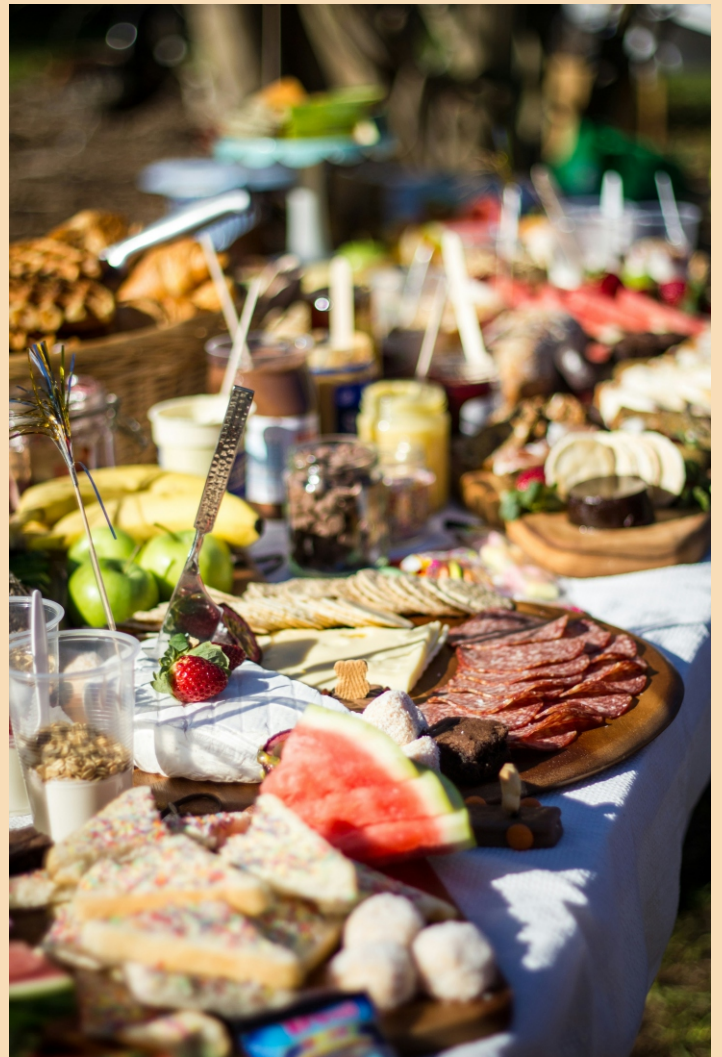

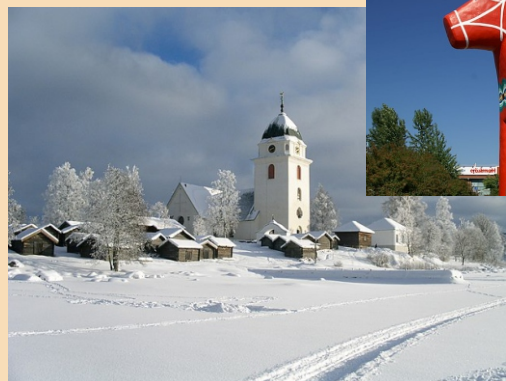
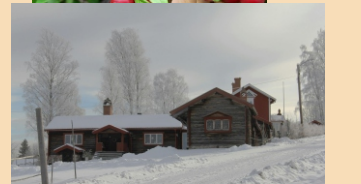

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Day 1 - Tuesday, July 1st -
Departure from USA

We'll fly to Newark again as SAS has a direct flight to Oslo from there

Day 2 - Wednesday, July 2nd -
Arrive in Oslo at Gardermoen Airport early in the morning.

We'll enjoy a guided tour of Oslo seeing the sites such as the Viking Ship Museum (re-opening in 2025), Kon-Tiki Museum, The Royal Palace from the outside and City Hall from the outside. Perhaps time to stroll on Karl Johangate (Oslo's walking street). Named after the Swedish king. Perhaps today or tomorrow, visit the World War II Resistance Museum at Akershus Fortress. Free time later in the day.

Overnight in Oslo at the Scandic Hotel Oslo City. Dinner included.

Day 3 - Thursday, July 3rd

After a leisurely Norwegian breakfast at the hotel. We'll visit the Norwegian Folk Museum and Frogner Park with Vigeland statues this morning. Lunch on your own. Afternoon free to perhaps take a city bus up to Holmenkollen Ski Jump from the 1952 Winter Olympics. Enjoy the view of the city from here. Afternoon free.

For those of you who are Edvard Munch the artist, fans. A trip to his museum is always fun. See the famous painting *The Scream*, known all over the world.

We'll take a fjord cruise this evening in the Oslo Fjord with dinner included. Overnight again at the Scandic Hotel Oslo City.

Day 4 - Friday, July 4th

Today after an early breakfast, we will depart on the first part of the Norwegian Fjords Tour. Taking the train from Oslo over the mountains to Myrdal. We change trains to the famous Flåm Railway at Myrdal. From Myrdal we descend 2,700 feet in 12 miles on the Flaam Railway to the water's edge of the Aurlandsfjord at the village of Flåm. We have some time to shop or visit the Flåm Railway museum (included in your tour). From Flåm we board the Fjord Boat and continue on the fjord up the Aurlandsfjord to the Sognefjord and then down the Naerøysfjord to the village of Gudvangen. You'll experience the narrowest of all fjords, with the mountains stretching to the sky. At Gudvangen we will take a bus to the Stalheim Hotel to enjoy the view of the immense valley and see the Nazi bunker from World War II.

We continue on to the village of Voss where we will eat dinner and overnight at Fleischer's Hotel. Free time this evening to walk around Voss and visit the Knute Rockne Memorial. Knute Rockne site and statue not far from our hotel. Also of interest is the Unique Voss Church.

Day 5 - Saturday, July 5th

Today we travel from Voss to the shores of the famous Hardanger Fjord where we make a stop at the beautiful village of Ulvik and the country church. In 1923, Lars B. Osa painted rosemaling paintings on the inside of the church.

There are many fruit orchards found in this area of Norway. From Ulvik, we drive along the shores of the majestic Hardanger Fjord, seeing the beautiful scenery and breathtaking waterfalls. We climb up to the Kvamskogen Plateau and down into the West Coast city of Bergen. Bergen, once a Hanseatic City, is surrounded by mountains and was not connected to Oslo with any railroad until the early 1900's.

Dinner and Overnight in Bergen at the Hotel Korskirken. This evening, perhaps you want to ride the Funicular to the top of the mountain, to partake in a breathtaking view of the City and the surrounding area.

Day 6 - Sunday, July 6th

Today, we spend the entire day in Bergen, by first taking a city tour with guide, to get our bearings and then free time afterwards to explore this Hanseatic City. We will walk from our hotel to the old Warehouse district in the Bergen Wharf area and enjoy the old town atmosphere. We will visit Edvard Grieg's home on the tour. Grieg is probably Norway's most famous composers.

Dinner and overnight in Bergen again at the Hotel Korskirken.

Day 7 - Monday, July 7th

We depart Bergen from the pier for a four-hour fjord boat cruise along the West Coast Archipelago, and then turn to

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the east as we enter the breathtaking Sognefjord (the longest fjord in the world). We cruise along the Sognefjord for our final destination for the day at, the village of Balestrand. Lunch on your own in Balestrand. In the afternoon your time is free to enjoy the scenery and lounge around, or go for a hike in the surrounding hills or mountains. Or sign up for an optional side tour.

Dinner and overnight in Balestrand at Kringsjå Hotell, where you might get a glimpse of Grandpa doing some woodcarving. Balestrand is known for its Swiss and Dragonstyle houses with the carved patterns attached to the houses. St. Olaf's Church is known as the English or Anglican Church. Perhaps do a tasting session of the famous fruit cider made in this area or even visit the Norwegian Travel Museum.

Day 8 - Tuesday, July 8th

This morning, we head north out of Balestrand on a fjord boat cruise on the Fjaerlands Fjord, an arm of the mighty Sognefjord. At the end of the fjord we come to Fjaerland where we will pay a visit to the Norwegian Glacier Museum. We will drive along the Innvikfjord and the Kjoenesford passing through the following towns, where we will stop at places of interest. Skei (on Sunnfjord), Byrkjelo (also known for production of the "TINE" brand of goat

cheese, Sandane (located at the end of Gloppefjord), Nordfjordeid (During the Viking Age, Nordfjordeid was referred to as Eygis, meaning the inner most part of a fjord. Nordfjord directly translated means 'North Fjord'. The kingdom of Firda was known as the kingdom of the fjords, and was divided into South Fjord and North Fjord. In old Norse the administrative region of Nordfjord was referred to *Nyrðri hlutr sýsla* and later *Nordfjord sýsla*. Thus Nordfjordeid is a literal description of the location of the town: the inner part of the northern fjord. Grodås (The village is located along the river Hornðøla on the eastern end of the lake Hornindalsvatnet. The village sits at the eastern end of the Kviven Tunnel, part of the new route for the highway E39 highway.

We will overnight here at Hellesylt and enjoy dinner on the mighty Geiranger Fjord, known the world over (UNESCO World Heritage List). Hellesylt is a small village. The village lies at the head of the Sunnylvsfjord, which is a branch of the Storfjord, and which the more famous Geirangerfjord in turn, branches off nearby.

Day 9 - Wednesday, July 9th

Today we take a fjord boat cruise from Hellesylt down the Geiranger fjord which is 15 kilometers long and 260 meters deep, surrounded by 800 meter

tall cliffs, We view the awesome scenery and the Seven Sisters Waterfall. We arrive at Geiranger for a lunch on our own stop and also picture-taking opportunities. Immerse yourself in the rich history on the earth the Vikings once explored. We continue on to Lom to see the famous stave church and on to Otta in the famous Gudbrandsdalen Valley, which eventually takes us back to Oslo.

Dinner and overnight here in Otta at Hotel Otta. Perhaps we will hear the story of Prillar Guri the heroine of Norway from the 1600's, from a local guide.

Day 10 - Thursday, July 10th

From Otta we continue the Gudbrandsdalen on to Vinstra and Ringebu. The home of the "Gudbrandsdalsost" or "Brunosten" - brown cheese - is a traditional Norwegian cheese. Gudbrandsdalsosten was found at Solbråsætra in Fron, later produced by Vinstra dairy. Today it is still produced in Gudbrandsdalen. The oyster was also found in Gudbrandsdalen and is today produced at Ringebu. These two form a good story about local food. We will stop and see the World Famous stave church at Ringebu, one of only 28 remaining stave churches in the world.

31 years after the 1994 Winter Olympics, we will pay a visit to the town of Lillehammer, seeing some of the Olympic sites as well as the famous folk museum of Maihaugen.

We end the day at our hotel in Hurdal, the Hurdalsjoen Hotel and Spa. Dinner and Overnight.

Day 11 - Friday, July 11th

Mid-morning departure from Gardermoen Airport on SAS to Newark and then connecting flights back to points in USA.

Old Sweden is divided into three sections: The southern third is called Götaland; the northern third is called Norrland and the middle third is called Svealand. "Svealand" or Middle Sweden, is the part of Sweden that most all tours of Scandinavia and Sweden neglect to visit, with its many interesting sites and fantastic scenery.

The provinces we will be visiting are Uppland, Gästrikland, Hälsingland, Medelpad, Ångermanland and Jämtland.

For those of you that are descendants of Swedish immigrants, we have noted the different historic provinces we will be visiting in the tour itinerary descriptions.

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DAY 1: Monday, June 30th - Meals Included: Dinner (on flight) Depart USA for Stockholm Depart from Chicago O'Hare International Airport or East or West Coast to Stockholm, Sweden. OR: request international departure from the city of your choice, dependent upon availability.

DAY 2: Tuesday, July 1st - Meals Included: Breakfast (on flight), Dinner - Arlanda - Sigtuna - Norrtälje - Gävle Arrival at Arlanda Airport outside of Stockholm, Sweden. After clearing Customs we will visit the ancient town of Sigtuna and its 1000 year old Main Street, Depart Sigtuna area and drive through the province of Uppland to the town of Norrtälje. Norrtälje serves as a marketplace for the nearby archipelago and its summer vacationers. We continue on to Gävle. Our final destination of the day is the city of Gävle located in the province of Gästrikland. Dinner and overnight at a four-star hotel.

DAY 3: Wednesday, July 2nd - Meals Included: Breakfast, Dinner - Gävle - Bollnäs - Skärså - Hudiksvall - Sundsvall - We will pay a visit to Gamla Gefle (Old Town Gävle). From Gävle we will continue up the East Coast of Sweden towards the coastal city of Hudiksvall on the Bothnian Sea. Driving into the province of Hälsingland and very near Söderhamn we will visit Bollnäs. Just north of Söderhamn we'll visit the picturesque fishing village of Skärså. At Hudiksvall we will see the well-preserved 19th century wooden buildings in Sweden at Fiskarstan (Fishermen's Town). Free time and lunch on your own along the way, before driving north into the province of Medelpad for a visit to the city of Sundsvall Dinner and overnight in Sundsvall at a four-star hotel.

DAY 4: Thursday, July 3rd Meals Included: Breakfast, Dinner Sundsvall, Härnösand, Höga Kusten, Nordingrå, & Örnsköldsvik. Motoring further along the coast we enter the province of Ångermanland where we will visit the town of Härnösand and its second largest (only Skansen in Stockholm is larger) open-air and historical museum at Murberget. Lunch on your own today. North of Härnösand the coast changes dramatically and forms Höga Kusten (The High Coast). This area of impressive and beautiful coastal landscape is perhaps Sweden's best kept secret. We'll cross some impressive bridges and visit the heart of Höga Kusten on the Nordingrå Peninsula and its fishing villages. Dinner and overnight in Örnsköldsvik at a four-star hotel.

DAY 5: Friday, July 4th Meals Included: Breakfast, Dinner Örnsköldsvik, Indalsälven, Ragunda, Östersund, & Persåsen We'll enjoy the view from Varvsberget over the archipelago before departing for Östersund and Persåsen. As we travel to Östersund, just a ways past Långsele, we will enter the province of Jämtland. On the road, in the beautiful Indals River Valley, we will visit a Thai pavilion at Ragunda. The pavilion was a gift from the King of Siam (now Thailand) who visited King Oskar II and this part of Sweden in 1897. It is 30 meters tall and presents a noticeable contrast in this very Swedish landscape. Lunch on your own today. Upon arrival in Östersund we will visit Jamtli museum and also Moose Park. We continue down the shores of Lake Storsjön to the village at Persåsen.

After checking into our hotel for two nights, we'll enjoy an evening dinner at our hotel in Persåsen with views of Hoverberg Mountain and Lake Storsjön. Gift shop, art gallery and carpenter's workshop are located on the premises for your enjoyment.

DAY 6: Saturday, July 5th Meals Included: Breakfast, Dinner Persåsen, Ovikens Parish, Fäbodvägen, & Persåsen Today we leave our suitcases at our hotel and enjoy a day trip through the area. We will travel along the well-known Fäbodvägen (High Pasture farm road). This road meanders between the settlements of Persåsen and Börtnan where there are many fäbodar (high pasture farms) to see and visit. This route represents a time period which will take you back 300 years in time from present-day Sweden to see the Sweden of old. We'll make a stop at Östra Arådalen to see a fäbod which is still being used today. You will see the animals exactly like it was in the times gone by. At Långbuan, halfway to Börtnan, we'll stop for Swedish Waffles with whipped cream and fruit preserves and enjoy the great Swedish coffee. Back at Persåsen we'll visit our hosts' Leif and Margith Wikners' Carpentry Shop (Snickarboden). This 45 year old family business produces wooden lamps, furniture and handcraft objects. We will enjoy dinner at our hotel.

DAY 7: - Sunday, July 6th - Meals Included: Breakfast, Dinner on flight Persåsen, Östersund Airport Arlanda - Depart for USA. After breakfast we depart for the Östersund Airport for our flight back to the USA via Arlanda Airport outside of Stockholm.

WEATHER

The weather in the Scandinavian countries can range from the low 50's to 70's in late August and the high 60's to low 80's in June, July and August and even cooler in the majestic Nordic mountains! In December, it will be around 25-35 degrees in Stockholm and 10 degrees cooler on average in Dalarna. On some days the skies will be cluttered with clouds, and on other days it might rain.

It is important to dress appropriately. Wear comfortable shoes in which you can walk with ease.

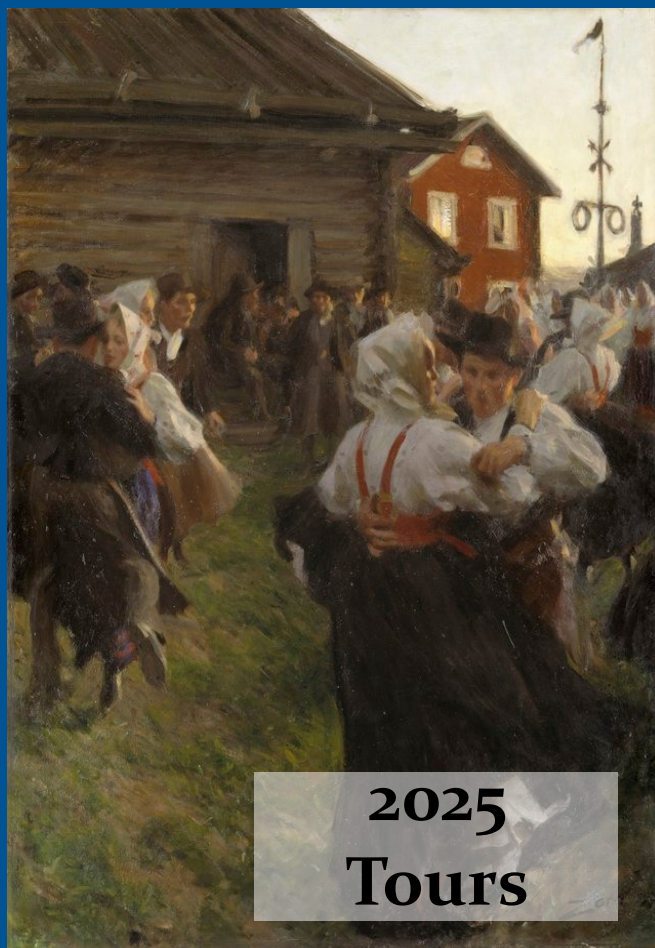
